Kelly Wells, UPIke's men's head basketball coach begins his 10th season with a 207-84 record, including the 2011 NAIA National Championship in 2011, which earned him the NAIA Coach of the Year award.

In 2013-14, the Bears' 31 wins were the most in the program's history, 17 of which set the Mid-South Conference league record. Kelly says his philosophy is simply asking his players to do uncommon things and be role models as good people as well as good players. They must sacrifice more than most other students in practice, participating in the games as well as keeping up with their studies.

He says there are about 40 student-athletes on the team, which include the 6 starters who returned from last year. They have 7 new recruits this year, two of which are Junior College transfers and two are local standouts from Sheldon Clark and East Ridge High Schools, both of which were leading scorers for their teams.

During the Q & A session, Kelly was asked about the 47 straight home-game win-streak the team has enjoyed lately. He said he was proud of the team, especially since the Mid-South Conference has 5 of the 8 nationally ranked teams in the top 25. UPIke is ranked 2nd, Georgetown is 5th, Campbellsville is 12th and the University of Cumberland is just outside the top 25.
