Ron Daley graduated from Berea College and obtained his Masters of Arts in History from Western KY University. He worked at Alice Lloyd College until he co-founded the Troublesome Creek Times weekly newspaper which he edited and published for 20 years and won more than 300 state and national newspaper awards.

He is a founding member of the East Kentucky Leadership Foundation. Ron is the founding chairman of the Knott-Hindman Community Development Initiative and has worked with local citizens and legislators to help

secure funding for the Knott Branch of HCTC, the Ky School of Craft and other CDI projects.

He was campus director from 1998-2003, founding director of the University Center of the Mountains from 2003-2008, and the Senior Director of Advancement and Governmental Relations 2008-2011 and served the Dean of Administrative Services until assuming his new duties in 2014. Ron has been active with P-16 Councils and is the chairman of the KY Association of Local P-16 Councils.

As part of Kentucky’s overall strategic plan to transform the workforce development system, the state created this framework whereby communities can agree to meet certain educational, workforce development and collaboration goals in order to earn “Work Ready Community In Progress” certification. By taking part in the effort, you will have the opportunity to transform your community’s economy and gain a competitive advantage in attracting new businesses and jobs.

In order to qualify, communities must meet or create plans to meet certain thresholds in criteria such as graduation rates, National Career Readiness Certificate holders and educational attainment rates. In addition, communities are required to bring various key agencies and employers together in the process. The process is designed to align education, workforce and economic development strategies for the state and within communities by using a collaborative approach.

KVEC hopes that all counties will put serious consideration into applying to become a Work Ready Community. Details of the program can be obtained from the following website:
